### 2.0 Meeting Notes – February 26

#### Welcome, Introductions, and Agenda

Leilani Gruener, Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), welcomed members of the Florida Occupant Protection Coalition (FOPC) and asked each member to introduce themselves and note which agency/organization they represent. She reviewed the agenda for both days of the meeting.

#### **Action Plan Implementation – Group Breakouts**

Coalition members divided into the three subcommittee groups — Education, Communication, and Outreach; Law Enforcement; and Occupant Protection for Children. Each group was instructed to discuss activities they have been working on since the last FOPC meeting, review their section(s) of the FOPC Action Plan, and update one another on progress toward achieving their assigned actions.

#### Strategic Action Plan Goal 1 – Education, Communication, and Outreach

Subcommittee members provided updates to their action steps and discussed actions to be completed prior to the next FOPC meeting. The FOPC Action Plan, with the updated status of the action steps, is attached as an Appendix of this summary report and can also be found at <a href="https://www.floccupantprotection.com">www.floccupantprotection.com</a>.

#### **FOPC Fact Sheet Update**

Leilani gave a presentation on the updated FOPC fact sheet for 2014-2018. Coalition members received a copy of the latest fact sheet and were asked to verify that their agency was correct and to contact her if any updates were

needed. She noted the child restraint survey data was included in this fact sheet, illustrating a three-year baseline trend for child restraint usage. She also highlighted additional charts of unrestrained fatalities and serious injuries broken down by urban and rural area, and by resident and non-resident.

Coalition members had the following questions and comments:

- How were Rural and Urban defined for the fact sheet data analysis?
  - The crashes are coded according to county based on the statutory definition of urban and rural counties.
- Add Trauma center to the list of partners.

#### Safe Mobility For Life Day

Leilani informed the Coalition members about the upcoming Safe Mobility for Life (SMFL) Day event, on May 28, 2020 in Jacksonville, Florida. This event is part of FDOT's SMFL Program and Coalition and aims to educate 150 older adults and community partners on understanding, planning and being proactive about ensuring safe mobility. Leilani noted the attendees of this event will participate in interactive experiences to promote various transportation options, as well as obtain educational materials from exhibitors. She asked interested members to complete a sign-up sheet for the SMFL e-newsletter and listsery.

Coalition members had the following questions and comments:

- Will there be a CarFit event at SMFL Day?
  - Yes. Fran Carlin-Rogers is training one staff from SMFL to do CarFit. In addition to CarFit, there will be other sessions like walking sessions, helmet fittings, FLOWmobile, JTA bus, etc.
- Danielle Kessenger, Wolfson Children's Hospital, Jacksonville, will reach out to Gail Holley, SMFL Program
  Manager, to suggest Northeast Florida Caregiver Coalition and an aging institute in Jacksonville, as potential
  partners for the event to get in contact.

#### Florida Transportation Plan (FTP) and Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP) Update

Danny Shopf, Cambridge Systematics, gave a presentation on the Florida Transportation Plan (FTP) and Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP) update. He played a video from the FTP website (www.floridatransportationplan.com) and explained how the FTP is the state's long-range transportation plan that guides policy framework for transportation decisions and investments. The FTP is updated every five years and was last updated in 2015. To guide the 2020 update of this plan, there is a Steering Committee, along with three subcommittees – the Automated, Connected, Electric, and Shared Vehicles (ACES) subcommittee, Resilience subcommittee, and Safety subcommittee. These subcommittees discuss the trends and planning implications on Florida's transportation system. Danny informed anyone can join these subcommittees as a "Friend" to share their thoughts and ideas and encouraged attendees to join any subcommittee of their subject matter interest.

Danny also briefed attendees on the SHSP, a data-driven plan, and reviewed fatalities and serious injuries under different traffic safety emphasis areas. He noted the SHSP was last updated in 2016 with a focus on crash data from 2011-2015, and the next update is expected to be finalized by early 2021. He presented Florida's roadway fatality

trends from 2012-2018 and highlighted that the fatality trend from 2014 to 2018 followed an upward slope. The SHSP aims to drive down the crashes to achieve Florida's vision of zero transportation-related fatalities.

Danny noted that occupant protection is one of the 13 identified emphasis areas in the current SHSP, and the FOPC's strategic plan supports the current SHSP. He reviewed unrestrained occupant crash data changes since the last SHSP was published. Data shows that during this period, occupant protection-related fatalities increased by 10 percent while serious injuries decreased by almost 9 percent. Danny concluded his presentation by providing some additional resources on FTP and SHSP and invited members to take the online surveys on the FTP website.

Coalition members had the following questions and comments:

- The 2016 version of SHSP is available on the FTP and FDOT Safety websites. It is also posted on the FOPC website.
- Funding on transportation safety is based on the crash statistics and strategies adopted in these plans. Hence, it is critical to recognize what is important to secure the funding for the safety strategies.
- Is there any target number of implementation strategies to prepare or update for the FTP or SHSP?
  - There is no such target number, but the committee tries to get as many strategies relevant to transportation safety as possible.

### 3.0 Meeting Notes – February 27

#### Recap of Day 1

Leilani provided an overview of the Day 1 discussion and outlined the Day 2 agenda.

#### Strategic Action Plan Goal 2—Law Enforcement Awareness of Occupant Protection

Subcommittee members provided updates to their action steps and discussed actions to be completed prior to the next FOPC meeting. The FOPC Action Plan, with the updated status of the action steps, is attached as an Appendix of this summary report and can also be found at <a href="https://www.floccupantprotection.com">www.floccupantprotection.com</a>.

#### **LEL Survey Questionnaire**

Charles Kane, Florida Law Enforcement Liaison (LEL) Program, gave a presentation on the LEL Survey that was conducted in 2019. He said they would like to refine the survey questions before sending the survey out this year. Charles reviewed each question and asked for feedback from the members.

Coalition members had the following questions and comments:

- Consider changing Question 4 to "Are you aware of your agency's policy on seat belt usage?"
- Add a field of "Why" as a response to answers for Questions 5A and 5B (Do you wear safety belt on duty/off duty?).
- Add a field of "Why" as a response to Question 6 (How does the use of safety belt affect Officer safety?).

- Limit Question 10 (If diversion programs are available, how often do you make referrals?) to those who
  responded that they knew there was a diversion program available in Question 9.
- The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) is producing a child restraint training video that could support of Question 12 (Would you find a training video on safety belt and child restraint enforcement helpful, if available?)
- Under Question 13, update the statistics and timeframe.
- Show a comparison of officers with on duty/ off duty safety belt awareness versus the officers who know wearing safety belt in the front seat reduces chances of fatal injury by 45 percent asked in Question 13E.

#### **Child Occupant Protection Booklet Distribution**

Charles provided an update on the distribution of the children's occupant protection ticket booklet. He reminded Coalition members that the booklet was meant to be distributed by law enforcement (LE) agencies to children for additional safety belt education for both children and their parents. To date, 11,076 booklets have been distributed and officers are receiving very positive responses from the recipients. He showed a map of agencies throughout the state that have already received the booklets and highlighted that the 100% of the agencies in the northwest and southern part of the state have received booklets. The LELs will continue to distribute to law enforcement agencies to that have not received the ticket books yet.

Petra Vybrialova, Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital, offered to assist in distributing booklets to some of the
agencies of the state that are yet to be covered.

#### Aging Road User Tip Card Update

At the last FOPC meeting, Charles gave a presentation on occupant protection safety for aging road users. He shared the draft reference card developed for officers to better understand safety belt enforcement as it relates to older drivers. The reference card includes educational information, brief instructions for minor vehicle adjustments that could help older drivers, and can be used as a visual reference to determine a safe distance from the steering wheel to the driver.

Coalition members had the following questions and comments:

- Consider adding a graphic of a person with headrest/ head restraint at the back of the card.
- Should there be references to adjusting mirrors? Especially if the seating position is adjusted, the mirrors likely need adjustment as well.
- Where are law enforcement officers keeping these reference cards?
  - Officers often keep reference cards like this on their clipboards or in their vehicles. While not all officers will keep and use reference cards, many will use these.
- Are there additional reference materials available for officers to distribute to the public?

This card is meant to be a tool for officers. There are references to CarFit on the cards where additional
materials are available. Officers may choose to give the card to drivers they interact with; it is easy for them
to request more.

#### **Safety Related Legislation Update**

Charles provided an update on recent proposed legislation related to child restrain requirements. He noted the proposed House Bill 567 (Senate Bill 476) requires children to remain in booster seats for an additional year (up to age six instead of age five). The proposed legislation was withdrawn. He also highlighted SB 158 (Vulnerable Road User Act), that requires criminal penalties for a person causing serious injury or death of a vulnerable road user. Charles noted any change on safety related legislation would require the Coalition to revise educational materials and redistribute the adjusted materials to reflect the new law.

#### Strategic Action Plan Goal 3—Occupant Protection for Children

Subcommittee members provided updates to their action steps and discussed actions to be completed prior to the next FOPC meeting. The FOPC Action Plan, with the updated status of the action steps, is attached as an Appendix of this summary report and can also be found at <a href="https://www.floccupantprotection.com">www.floccupantprotection.com</a>.

#### **Child Passenger Safety Training Curriculum Update**

Amy Artuso, National safety Council, shared an update on the 2020 National Child Passenger Safety (CPS) Technician certification training. The new instructor guide was launched on February 1, 2020. The CPS technician and instructor guide and module resource materials were all developed collaboratively with trainers, technicians, and the public/partners. The curriculum update includes a revised Technician guide child occupant glossary, revised curriculum (CPS technician role, seat belt system, air bags, introduction to car seat and booster seats, etc.) for technicians and instructors with an emphasis on adult learning and are available online for download through the CPS Board website (www.cpsboard.org). She reviewed examples of the content included in the instructor guide, highlighting recent changes that were made based on feedback from instructors. Amy noted the technician guides can be made available through the Occupant Protection Resource Center (OPRC).

Amy also provided instructions on how to view CPS instructor webinars, tip videos and other reference materials. Detail steps for login in and downloading materials can be found in the <u>presentation slides</u> on the at <u>www.floccupantprotection.com website</u>. Amy said flash drives that include all resources are available for order.
