CIOT Yard Signs as of May 17, 2022







Law Enforcement Considerations When encountering Elder Drivers

Is the driver wearing their seat belt? If not, ask why. Be sensitive. If they have a medical reason; refer them to their doctor.

Does the driver know that seat belts must be used in conjunction with airbags, and failing to use a seat belt can cause greater injury from the Airbags.

Are they wearing their seat belt correctly?

There should be at least ten inches between the driver's chest or torso away from the airbag to reduce injuries from the airbag.

Can the driver see over the steering wheel. The driver's sightline should be at least 3 inches above the top of the steering wheel.

The steering wheel housing with the airbag in its center, should be adjusted so the center is aimed toward the driver's chest and

The head restraint is a safety device used to prevent whiplash and resulting neck injuries. The correct position is when it is within 2 1/2 inches or closer from the center of the back area of the driver's head. Touching the back of the head is OK



Law Enforcement Considerations when Encountering Elder Drivers



Is the driver wearing their safety belt? If not, ask why. Be sensitive. If they have a medical reason, refer them to their doctor.


Does the driver know that safety belts must be used in conjunction with airbags? Failing to use a safety belt can cause greater injury from an activated airbag.



Is the driver wearing their safety belt correctly?

Driver's chest or torso should be at least 10 inches away from the steering wheel to reduce injuries if airbag is activated.

The steering wheel should be adjusted so its center (which contains the airbag) is aimed toward the driver's chest or torso.





The head restraint is used to prevent whiplash and resulting neck injuries. The driver's head should be no more than 2 ½ inches away from the head restraint. The back of the head touching the head restraint is OK.

Some driver mobility issues, such as not being able to reach for the safety belt, may be remedied with a simple product available at a local retailer or online.


