- Car seats to accommodate medical conditions and adaptive needs of patients
- Wheelchair transportation
- Role of a therapist
- Family assessments and visits

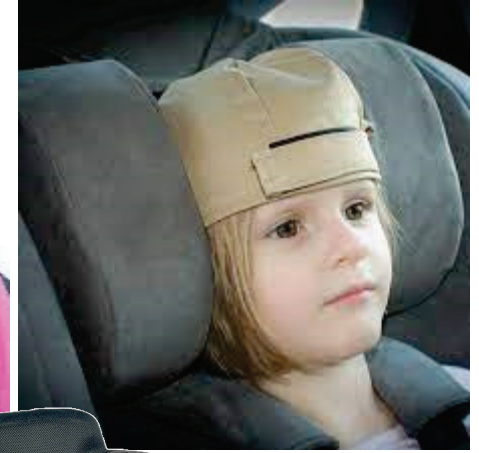
Car beds and rear-facing

- Low birth weight
- Allow for supine and sideline positioning
- NICU (tolerance test)
- Other conditions (spina bifida, casts, etc.)
- Jefferson
- Conventional rear-facing



Large Medical Seats

- Children who no longer fit the weight or height of a conventional car seat but can't sit unassisted
- long-term medical conditions (cerebral palsy, weight)
- variety of support can be ordered



Booster seats, vests, and wheelchairs



- Allow for positioning help to even higher weights
- Assist families with children who escape
- Laydown vests
- Wheelchairs
